Summer Intensive in the Twin Cities asserts: I Deserve a Shot!

"I Deserve a Shot" was a five-day intensive in which Black youth in the Twin Cities metro sought to unpack, understand, and learn about dismantling oppressive systems. With the help of AFSC staff Brynne Crockett, Prescott Jones and Maddie Foss, youth built a race analysis and learned about how systematic racism in poor communities is perpetuated and sustained through power. The initiative intentionally sought to celebrate, inform, and uplift the Black and brown youth of Minneapolis in reclaiming the safety of their community.

Intercollegiate action network to address militarized forces in St. Louis

Alex Jones, Organizing Fellow for the St. Louis Healing Justice Program, writes: "Currently, my focus is on the establishment of an intercollegiate Action Network in Saint Louis. The universities in the area, especially the private ones, have a direct link to Saint Louis policing. The goal of the network is to coordinate direct actions across the city to demand that all universities defund, refuse gifts, and completely eliminate their relationships with militarized forces in Saint Louis.
