Making the case for Second Look legislation in Michigan

In this recent <u>opinion piece</u>, Cozine Welch, a statewide organizer for the AFSC Michigan Criminal Justice Program, writes: "The first thing our state legislators should do before the end of the 2023 legislative session is pass the Second Look Sentencing Act. This bill would allow courts to reevaluate sentencing after incarcerated persons serve a certain amount of time in prison and no longer pose a risk to the community. Given the repeated failures of Michigan's criminal legal system, this legislation couldn't be more necessary."

SAFE Program promotes restorative practices in the Twin Cities

From Brynne Crockett, Twin Cities Healing Justice Program Director: AFSC is in a formal partnership with Minneapolis Public Schools to implement a Restorative Practices program within North Community High School. In our SAFE program (Students Accelerating Fiercely Everyday), we provide trainings for students and faculty.

SAFE also trains a 12-member youth board cohort who meet monthly to learn about organizing and mobilizing against systems of oppression. Together, we create campaign work around public safety and reforming the punitive measures taking place in the education system specifically related to suspension disparity gaps.
