
Barbara Gunn Lartey now leading AFSC peacebuilding work in St. Louis


In Michigan, promoting Second Look and clemency recommendations

The AFSC Michigan Criminal Justice Program continues to organize for liberation, using our freedom to free others. Along with partners, AFSC is pushing for the legislature to adopt Second Look legislation, which would give people serving life and long sentences an opportunity to be reviewed for possible release by their sentencing judge. In July, staffers Natalie Holbrook-Combs, Claudia McLean and Pete Martel published Recommendations for Clemency Process: A Community-Centered Approach. Thanks to pressure from Friends and others, lowa to feed more hungry kids

AFSC is very pleased to share the <u>news</u> that Iowa Gov. Kim Reynolds has heard the call from Iowans – including many Friends – to do more to feed hungry kids during the summer months. Jon Krieg, AFSC staff in Des Moines, wrote this <u>op-ed</u> and helped <u>deliver a petition</u> to the governor's office from over 3500 Iowans calling for the state to join the federal SUN Bucks program (formerly known as Summer EBT.) The work in Iowa is part of AFSC's national **No Hunger Summer** campaign.
