We are Quakers (Friends), a spiritual community committed to peace, equality, and justice. Our faith calls us to live with integrity and compassion, and to act for a world where every person is treated with dignity.

Why Are We Here Today?

Today, we gather in silent worship as an act of public witness against fear, violence, and authoritarianism—and in solidarity with communities facing harm and dehumanization. Our presence says:

- Every person has worth.
- Love and fairness must replace fear and cruelty.
- Communities thrive when all are welcomed.

What Is Quaker Worship?

Quaker worship is a communal time of silent, expectant waiting. We gather without clergy or sermons, just open hearts and minds, listening for the inward presence of the Spirit.

- Silent and Centered: We begin in stillness, seeking divine guidance.
- Open to All: Anyone may join us in this quiet space.
- Speaking into the Silence: If someone feels deeply led, they may share a brief message for the spiritual nurture of the group. Silence continues between messages for reflection.
