
In downtown San Diego and Los Angeles.

Highlights

The U.S.-Mexico border tour will begin south of San Diego near the San Ysidro port of entry and continue to Friendship Park, the southwesternmost corner of the U.S.-Mexico border. Local AFSC staff will talk with you about the impacts of the wall on border communities and share firsthand accounts of our work.

Travel to Los Angeles to visit AFSC's Roots for Peace downtown urban farm where you'll meet community members working to improve access to healthy foods while addressing racial injustice. Share an outdoor meal in the garden and get a mural tour from AFSC youth leaders.

Visit the Japanese American Museum to learn about AFSC's history of working to overcome injustice, including speaking out against the forced removal and incarceration of Japanese Americans during World War II.



Cost

\$2,000 per person \$3,250 per couple
